Our **Year 11** students smashed all previous records in the summer examinations. 72% of students achieved at least 5 A\*-C grades (including English and Maths). This was a huge improvement on last year's figure of 51% and is a considerable increase on the previous record of 66%

72.06% of students achieved the key benchmark of 5 A\* to C grades including English and Maths – a new record  
85.7% of students achieved 5 A\* to C grades – a new record  
99% of students achieved at least 5 A\* to G grades – a new record  
99.05% of students achieved at least one grade C – a new record  
And 100% of students achieved at least one grade G – a new record

Exceptional performances came from Sanya Kurmani who achieved 11 A\* and Vikram Rajasekar and Aarthi Suresh who achieved 10 A\* grades. Oliver Port, Michael Murphy and Imogen Crook gained 7 A\* and there were other notable performances from Danielle Slade, Emma Callaghan, Fiona Connolly, Rachel Wright and Hannah Stevens who each achieved 6 A\*.

Our **Sixth Form** students also had a very successful year. 53% of A level grades were at A\*, A or B – an improvement on last year and well ahead of the national average. They achieved a pass rate of 99% with 37 different subjects attaining 100% pass mark.

We are delighted that two of our students will now be going on to study at the most prestigious universities of Oxford and Cambridge. Sophie Rutherford has gained a place to read English at Homerton College, Cambridge and Nick Lyons is to read French and German at Merton College, Oxford. They will be joining the four students from English Martyrs who went to Oxford and Cambridge last year.

A highlight of this year's results are the A\* grades which were achieved in seventeen separate subjects. Forty-three individual students managed to achieve the A\* grade which was introduced last year – a grade which requires a mark of over 90%. Tom Hickey, Ashleigh Kitchen, Laurence Jones and Matthew Robertson all achieved 3 A\* grades each. Many students achieved 2 A\*. Katherine Berry who passed with 3 A's and a B has managed to gain a place at Nottingham University to study Veterinary Science – one of the most competitive university courses.

These fantastic results are due to the efforts of our students and staff. I would also like to thank parents for the part which they have played. Our students would not have done so well without the encouragement and support of their parents and guardians.
